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Attendance of Students in Term 4 2012

With school staff involved in school development days at the end of Term 4 in 2012, students in **Years 7, 8, 9 10 and 11** are required to attend school until **Wednesday 19th December 2012**.

For students in **Year 10**, changes to the school leaving age brought about by the Education Amendment Act 2009 will have an impact on the date on which they may leave school. Year 10 now complete the school year at the same time as the rest of the school – **Wednesday 19th December 2012**.

First Day for Students 2013

Staff will return to school on Tuesday 29th January 2013 for a Staff Development Day.

Students in **Year 7,11,12** will return to school on **Wednesday 30th January 2013**.

Students in **Years 8,9,10** will return to school on **Thursday 31st January 2013**.

Trade Training Centre – Construction to commence

The construction of the Metals and Engineering Trade Training Centre is about to commence. This involves shutting down a number of rooms in the TAS block while the \$680,000 worth of improvements are made. It is a great enhancement for the school.

The construction will cause disruptions over the majority of 2013 – but the short term pain will be well worth the long term gain. A special thank-you to Mr Frangos who has worked extremely hard with the project management team and has demonstrated great leadership in this area.

Maintenance Update

Over the Christmas holidays, “A Block” external surfaces will be repainted. So hopefully this will provide our main block with a bit of a facelift!

School Pilot Update

I would like to provide an update about the trial of increased flexibility in recruitment, staffing and budgeting that our school has been involved in for the past three years. We are continuing with the program in 2013 where we will be one of the first schools in the state to:

- Manage our complete staffing budget.
- Work with the new business reform package.



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Some of the benefits so far have included:

- The employment of additional staff to focus on teaching in the classroom.
- A Computer Network Technician.
- Head Teacher development roles.
- Promotions and Communications Officer.
- The ability to target additional maintenance funds for the school.

Uniform and Shoes for 2013

It is great to see the vast majority of students wearing the correct school uniform.

Toronto High School is currently working with State Office to lease out our Uniform Shop to an external provider. Over 2013 we will be consulting with parents, staff and students regarding an updated uniform. I stress that it will not be a new uniform but more of a revision and update. It will be discussed at a P&C meeting early next year – so get along and have a look and a say!

Black leather shoes are the only acceptable shoes (except for sport). These shoes will have ***no markings*** (like the Nike Swoop etc) and will be a plain black leather shoe.



'Hoodies' are not allowed at school. When purchasing a jumper for next year – please ensure that it doesn't have a hood.

When you enter a school and see students in the correct uniform it creates a very positive impression of the school.

The school uniform is just like a uniform worn in the workplace. If you are working at McDonalds and you arrive for a shift in 'almost the right uniform' – you will be sent home. It is an important habit to develop.

If you are experiencing financial difficulties, please contact the school so that we can assist.



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Student Assistance Scheme

Parents experiencing financial difficulty in meeting school expenses including subject specific fees and uniforms are invited to confidentially contact me to discuss the process. A limited amount of funds is supplied by the Government for needy families to assist with educational expenses. I encourage parents to seek this assistance.

STRANGER DANGER

The NSW Police have specifically asked that schools be made aware of incidences involving suspicious behaviour. A serious approach was this week made to students at an Ourimbah school (whilst in school grounds), and there seems to be more than one person involved in this instance.

Therefore in line with previous advice re Stranger Danger, students are advised to use appropriate safe behaviours at, and to and from school. I realise that Ourimbah is some distance away, however by vehicle it is not that far. A description has been provided for your information by the principal of the school involved.

"Yesterday, a man tried to entice our students to leave the school grounds. He used the excuse that he wanted to share his chocolate milk with them. He was approximately 45 -50 yrs old, with a roundish face, had brown hair with grey coming through, a goatee or handlebar beard with plenty of grey in it & was of medium build with a pot belly. He wore a brown, suede bomber jacket, a navy tee shirt, cream trousers & dark shoes. He got into the passengers' side of a silver car that was waiting around the corner."

This is an extremely serious issue and we urge students, parents and staff to be aware at all times of any suspicious behaviour.

Year 10

Students and parents are reminded that there are no School Certificate examinations that will be administered externally by the Board of Studies this year.

The final day of attendance for Year 10 in 2012 is **Wednesday 19th December**.

Playground

Students are reminded about the necessity of keeping our grounds neat and tidy, therefore disposing of any rubbish they have in the waste bins provided in the playground. In particular for those students who enter via the Awaba Road entrance could they please ensure rubbish is disposed of properly.



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At Toronto High School we encourage all students to take pride in their school therefore when visitors enter our grounds first impressions are lasting impressions. *Be proud of your school!!*

Appropriate Behaviour

May I remind students that whilst out in the community, either before school, after school or on school excursions etc that it is expected that appropriate behaviour will be displayed at all times. Students – you represent our school especially with the wearing of our school uniform so please wear it proudly and with pride. It is an honour to receive feedback from the community about how well behaved our students are. Any **inappropriate** behaviour will not be tolerated.

Zero Tolerance

With regard discipline matters – a zero tolerance exists for sexual or racial harassment, physical violence or harassment of staff. Students are constantly reminded of these basic requirements, on our daily assemblies.

Toronto High School promotes the Charter of Dignity and Respect in the workplace. From the morning assembly, students are sent daily off to class, with the message – “Show **respect** at all times for teachers, other school staff and helpers, including **following class rules**, speaking **courteously** and **co-operating** with **instructions** and all **learning activities**.”

Uniform

Uniform continues to be emphasised at Toronto High School and our standard is consistently good among the students. As items of uniform are replaced, parents are reminded to ensure the items being purchased satisfy Toronto High School’s uniform requirements. Details of the correct uniform are displayed on our website.

Leaving school without approval

I remind all students about the protocols of leaving school during the day. If sick, students may report to sick bay, contact will be made with family and if possible, students will be collected by a family member and will be signed out of school by the office staff.

Students may seek an early leave pass

A note from parents must be provided before school, detailing dates, time and reason. This note will be countersigned by one of the deputies, will be presented to the office for recording and the early leave pass will be available for collection by the student at the nominated time. The student will be signed out of school by office staff.

Absence from School

All absences **MUST** be explained with a note, on the student’s return to school. The note must include student’s full name, Roll class, date of absence and reason for being absent.

At Formal Assemblies, Toronto High recognises those many students, who have maintained an exemplary attendance record. It is emphasised to all students, that attendance details are printed on the front cover of school reports and become a significant piece of information for future employers to consider, when offering jobs to students.

It is compulsory that Year 10 students attend school up until the end of the school year. Students who do not attend classes will have their Year 11 subject choices removed. They will reselect from what is available in 2013.

If students are not returning to Year 11 and have found full time employment, they need a letter from their employer and their parent detailing that more than 25 hours work per week is involved. Only then can they sign out at the end of Year 10.

The Years 10 & 11 Presentation Ceremony is on Tuesday 18/12/2012 commencing at 11.35am.

Wednesday	8.00am to 8.15am	1.00pm to 1.20pm

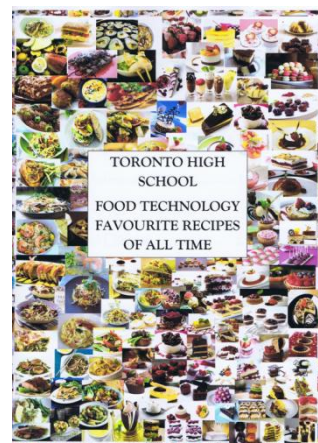

From the Careers Office

*I have been in contact with many of our **Year 12 students from 2012** and it is great to hear what they are planning and where they are heading to start their careers. It is still not too late to enrol in University or TAFE courses. I look forward to getting feedback from this year's Year 12 as they pursue their careers.*

TVET – these TAFE delivered courses have closed, however this does not stop students coming to see me to try for a late enrolment in a TVET course. We have had some success with students enrolling. If students are interested in a course that is not available through school I may be able to help.

TRY-A-Skills this year was held at the Newcastle Jockey Club and proved a worthwhile event with 50 Year 10 students having the opportunity to try different jobs in a “hands on” environment.

Scholarships will soon be available for students from years 11 and 12. The Defence Force Technical Scholarships are available for students in both 11 and 12 who are completing technical subjects such as Metal and Engineering VET, Information Technology VET or Engineering Studies and at least General Maths. These scholarships are worth \$2000 for Year 11 and \$3000 for Year 12, certainly worth applying, you may win won. Scholarships are available at different times through the year so it is advisable to keep checking the emails I send to all students in Years 10 to 12.

Jobs Info is still being emailed out to all students in Years 10 to 12 and sometimes I include Year 9 if there are suitable casual jobs. Parents should encourage their children to check these emails weekly they are generally sent on Mondays. I also include training courses that suit our students' needs.

Career Links Work Placement Awards - Congratulations to **Logan Sharpe** for receiving an award in the recent Career Links Work Placement Awards for his placement at Toronto Auto Mechanical at Carey Bay. Logan received the award for “Demonstrating Exceptional Teamwork in the Workplace”. **Savannah Atkins** was nominated for an “Excellence Award in Hospitality” through her placement at Café Bon Oz.

GRIP Leadership Conference - I had the pleasure of attending the **GRIP Leadership** conference at Newcastle Town Hall recently and was very proud of our Year 11/12 Student Leaders, I believe they gained a lot from the experience and this will be an important step towards becoming community leaders in the future.

Year 10 students looking at leaving at the end of the year (19th December) are reminded that they need a permanent job (minimum 25 hours per week) or to be enrolled in a full time training course such as TAFE. Students or parents require more information can contact me for more information.

Tax File Numbers can be applied for by picking up the form from the Career Office completing it and returning it to the Careers office, a Tax File number is required for any type of paid work.

*It is good to see a steady flow of **Year 11 students** coming to see me to ensure their subject selections will get them to where they want to be and maybe drop a subject ready for the reduced load required for Year 12.*

What makes you really angry?

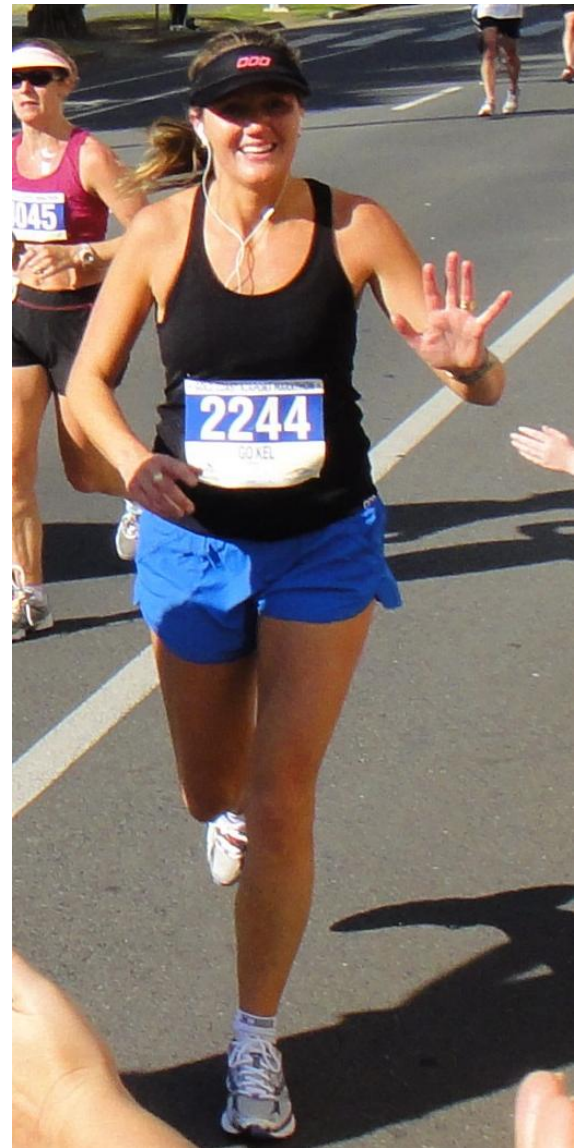

Kate Broekman

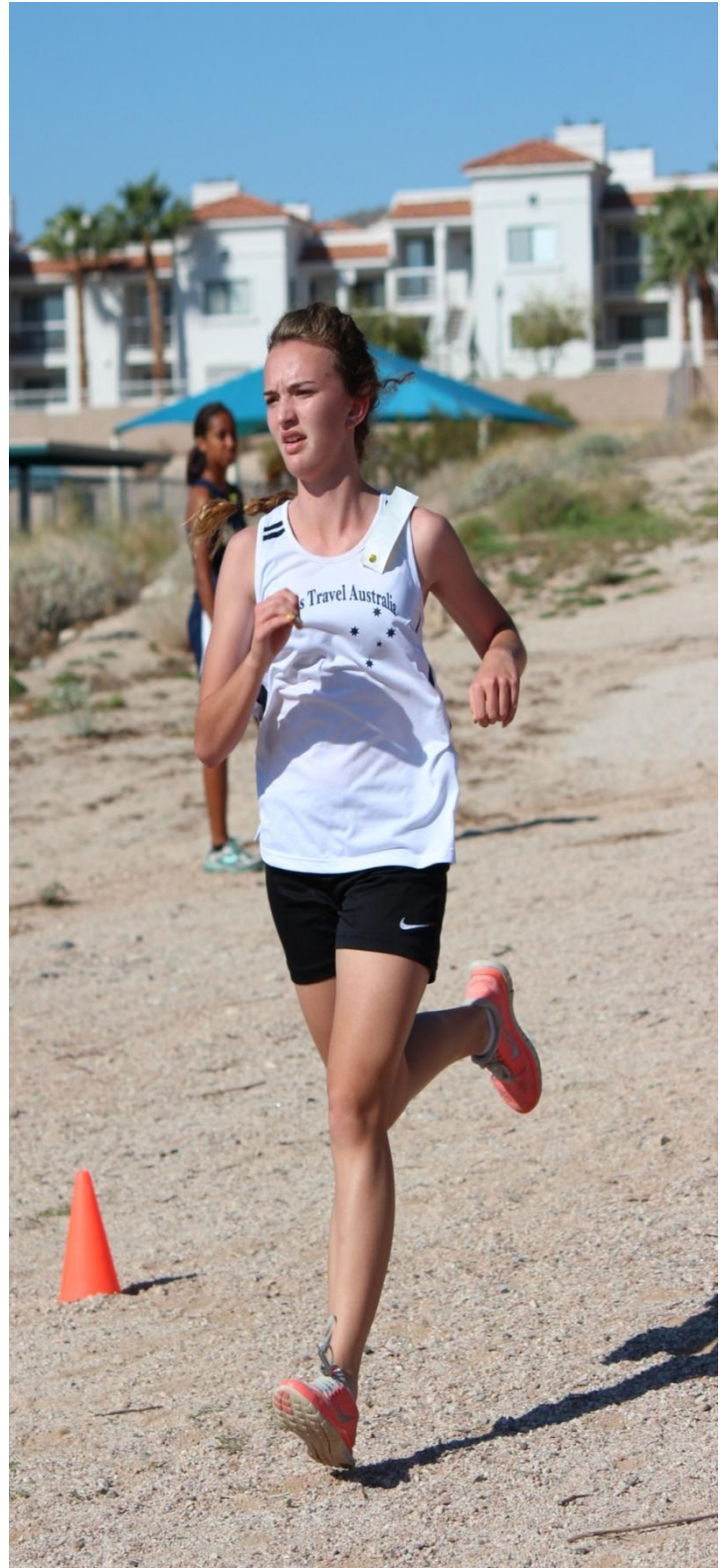
Kate was recently given "a once in a lifetime opportunity" to compete in the USA.

Kate thanks Toronto High for being able to do some fundraising to help offset some of the cost of the tour.

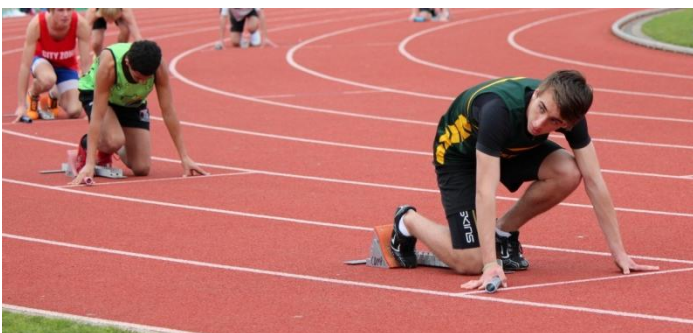
