At the beginning of Week 3, our new permanent Head Teacher Science will commence. His name is Mr Dan Raso. He has been a Head Teacher Science for the previous 5 years, so he comes to the school with plenty of experience.

NAPLAN 2013

Once again, our students performed extremely well in the NAPLAN exams. The results have once again cemented Toronto High School as a great school.

Well done and congratulations to all of the students involved.

Your child's report will show his or her results in comparison with all other students from the same year group in Australia who sat the tests, and will include:

- the national average;
- the range for the middle 60 per cent of students; and
- whether your child has achieved the national minimum standards.

An important feature of the national assessments is that your child's achievement in literacy and numeracy is now measured against common national assessment scales that continue from Year 3 through to Year 9. This means that as your child advances through school and has these assessments every second year, you will be able to monitor your child's progress in literacy and numeracy. Another important feature of the report is how the achievement of the national minimum standard is shown. The old 'benchmark' report showed achievement of the national minimum standard as being above or below a single score. The new report shows the national minimum standard as a full band on the scale. For example, the national minimum standard for Year 7 is Band 5. If your child's result is in this band, then he or she has typically demonstrated the basic elements of literacy and numeracy needed to participate in school in Year 7. If your child's result is in the bottom band for the year level, he or she has not achieved the basic skills of literacy and numeracy for that year, and needs focused intervention and additional support to help achieve the skills required to fully participate in schooling.

Year 11 Parent/Teacher Night

An information evening is scheduled for Wednesday 6 November, 5pm to 7pm in the school library. The evening is designed for parents to meet with their child's teachers to discuss any aspects of their schooling as well as any questions they may have regarding the HSC requirements.

Bookings must be made online and students will be issued with information in this regard in the coming weeks.

HSC Exams

By the time this bulletin is released, the HSC will have commenced for our students. I would like to wish all of our Year 12 students good luck with their exams – although if they study and work hard with their preparations – they won't require luck! I look forward to reporting their results and future paths.

New Revised Uniform & Shoes

Toronto High School has awarded the Uniform Shop lease to 'Daylight'. There will be changes to the school uniform – mainly a 'style change' and the inclusion of the school emblem/logo on our uniform pieces. These will be the only accepted pieces of uniform. Year 7 and Year 11 will move into the new uniform in 2014. All other years have the option of continuing to wear the current uniform, or when they grow out of it they will purchase the new uniform. If students wish to purchase and wear the new uniform, they may.

The P&C, staff and students were consulted on the changes. Information will be provided shortly regarding the new uniform shop. It will be located at the front of the school hall closest to Field Ave.

It is great to see the vast majority of students wearing the correct school uniform.

We will be conducting further gate inspections over the course of the year.

As the end of the year approaches we will be advertising to all families the correct uniform requirements (including shoes) so that purchases can be made for 2014.

Black leather shoes are the only acceptable shoes (except for sport). These shoes have no markings (like the Nike Swoop etc) and are a plain black leather shoe. We will send information out before the end of Term 4.

When you enter a school and see students in the correct uniform it creates a very positive impression of the school.

The school uniform is just like a uniform worn in the workplace. If you are working at McDonalds and you arrive for a shift in 'almost the right uniform' – you will be sent home. It is an important habit to develop.

Last Day of School 2013

It's now Term Four and *the last day for all students is Wednesday 18 December 2013.* Staff finish the week with Thursday/Friday being pupil free days allowing several courses on professional development to run.

Year 11

Year 11 students will be flat out this term as they start their Year 12 course. It is vital that they take it seriously as they will complete 25% of their HSC course this term. From this point on all marks will go towards their HSC and they must keep their attendance over 85% to meet all course outcomes. Year 11 Parent/Teacher night is scheduled for 5pm-7pm Wednesday 6 November 2013. This is a good opportunity to discuss your child's progress and gain an understanding of what will occur in the HSC course.

Yearly Exams

This term the school is in yearly exam and report mode. The kids are greatly excited. Year 7 to 10 have their yearly exams in Week 4. If any student misses an exam please fill out the student appeal form available from the DP's or Print Room. These need to be completed on the first day back or your appeal may not be upheld. Include medical certificates or statutory declarations as necessary.

As always student behaviour, attitude and work ethic is a focus each day. Term 4 is important for all students especially the juniors as work and results from this period will determine class placements next year.

BYOD... (Bring your own Device)

Is the next phase in the use of technology in schools. It is not bring your own smart phone. These devices will be too limited and will not synchronise with school systems. For many reasons it has been decided that phones will not be part of Toronto High School's BYOD program.

The government has stopped supplying laptops to Year 9 students and the only way to maintain teaching with technology is for parents to provide a device for their child. There will be a flood of new devices hitting the market soon as manufacturing rushes to fill the void.



At this stage we are trying to research what type of device and specifications can be supported by the school system, so **please do not rush out and buy something today**. We will distribute information to parents in the near future. No child in Year 9, 2014 will be disadvantaged by not having a device.

Illness/misadventure on exam day

If you become ill or suffer an accident that affects your exam performance, you should submit an Illness/Misadventure Appeal Form through myself, Mrs Reilly, Deputy Principal, and notify the Presiding Officer when entering the exam or as soon as possible. These forms are available from the School Print Room.

It is important that you attend the exams where possible even if you believe your performance in the exam will be affected. If you cannot attend an exam because of illness or misadventure, notify your Deputy Principal immediately. You should never risk harm in order to attend an exam, or attend an exam against medical advice.

You must obtain documentary evidence generally on the day of the exam to support your illness/misadventure appeal. If you did not sit the exam this evidence must indicate why you were unable to attend. BOARD OF STUDIES STUDENTS ONLINE

The Board is sending an email to all Year 10 students inviting them to activate their Students Online account. Year 11 students who have not yet activated their Students Online account will also be sent an email.

Students Online is a website designed specifically for senior students as their source of information from Year 10 to the HSC. All students in Years 10, 11 and 12 can now log in to their personal account section called 'My Details' and see their personal study information and contact details.

Students need to have an email address recorded on the Board's system to be able to activate their account. Grades for Year 10 and Year 11, as well as Year 12 HSC results, will be released via Students Online on the following dates:

Usage of Mobile Phones & Ipods

The use of mobile phones and Ipods during class time is not allowed. School policy outlines that phones should not be brought to school and parents should attempt contact with their students through the usual protocols – call the Front Office and a message will be delivered to the student.

Board of Studies Rules for the Higher School Certificate, prohibit the use of mobile phones, Ipods and other non-approved electronic devices in examination centres.

Information sheet for parents and caregivers about the Essential Secondary Science Assessment

The Essential Secondary Science Assessment (ESSA) is an assessment program for all students in Year 8. An interactive, multimedia online test called ESSAonline is held in November each year. It is a diagnostic test that will provide information about what your child knows and can do in science. Tasks in the test are framed on Stage 4 outcomes and essential content in the NSW *Science Years 7–10 Syllabus*.

Students will be tested on their:

- knowledge and understanding of science
- understanding and skills in the process of scientific investigation, which includes using a simulated experiment
- ability to evaluate evidence, make judgements and think critically
- ability to access information and communicate scientific ideas using a variety of strategies.

ESSAonline takes approximately 80 minutes. It contains video, animations, audio, graphics, text and a variety of test items. It also includes a survey about students' attitudes to the test, science and their learning of science. Each student needs earphones to be able to complete ESSAonline on a computer.

The confidentiality of each student's results is safeguarded by NSW legislation which prohibits the publication of results of particular individuals. The legislation also prevents the results of schools being publicly revealed in a way that ranks or compares the results of particular schools. Additionally, information provided by students about their language base, Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander background and survey responses are treated confidentially to ensure that all students' right to privacy is maintained.

If your child has a disability that needs special consideration or has been educated in English for less than one year, please contact your child's school to discuss special provisions or possible exemption from ESSAonline. Special provisions will be provided for students with documented learning support. For example, Braille versions of the test are available for students who are registered as visually impaired.

Results of ESSAonline will be available in Term 1 in the year following the test. A personal report prepared for each student will describe the scientific knowledge and skills demonstrated by the student in the test. There will also be information about how the student's results compare with overall performance of all students in the test.

The principal of your child's school will be able to provide you with more information concerning ESSAonline should you require any additional information. If you need an interpreter to assist you to make an appointment, call the Telephone Interpreter Service on 131 450 and they will phone the school for you. The school will arrange to have an on-site interpreter present at the meeting, if requested. These services will be free of charge to you.

Welfare programs



At Toronto High we have many fantastic welfare programs running to continually support our students at times when a little extra help may be needed.

This year one of the programs we have running is 'Seasons For Growth' which is based on the belief that loss, grief and change are a normal and valuable part of life. This program provides the opportunity for students who have experienced a loss or change to integrate the appropriate knowledge, skills and attitudes to cope by providing support for the young people to understand and manage the issues they experience due to changes such as death, separation or divorce.

The program uses the four seasons as a metaphor for the four stages of the grief process;

- autumn come to terms with reality of loss
- winter personal experiences of loss learn about emotions of grief
- Spring provide skills for students to process their own grief
- Summer encourage students to explore letting go and moving on



The program is facilitated by Student Support Officer, Madelyn Smith, School Counsellor Jo Wickham, and School Chaplain James Iuliano. The program runs one period a week for 9 weeks and is of no cost to the students participating.

INVITATION TO STUDENTS "PRINTING & PHOTOCOPY SERVICE"

THS currently offers a printing and photocopy service in the school library to our students. This service is primarily used by students who do not have access to a computer and internet facilities at home, for the completion and printing of homework/assignments etc.

In order to increase our efficiencies within the school, our existing procedures have been improved and we are inviting our students to avail themselves of these changes. The new system offers cheaper costs, flexibility, efficiency and convenience to both students and staff. Our new "Printing & Photocopy Service" is available to all students.

Questions & Answers

1. What do I need to do? How do I get started?

A. Students simply need to visit the school's front office and place a minimum of \$5.00 on their account. Students then take their receipt to the Library and an account will be created.

2. Then what?

A. The student will then be issued with a PIN to allow access to the printing and photocopy services.

3. Can someone else use my PIN?

A. If you give someone else your PIN or do not store it securely then it is to your detriment – you are liable for any printing costs and your printing account will be charged.

4. If I have lost/forgotten my PIN what do I do?

A. We can reissue you with your PIN, please see library staff.

5. **Do I have to do my printing this way?**

A. No you don't. *It is not mandatory*, but it is more cost efficient, time efficient and more convenient. You print what you want, when you want, before school/after school, and you collect it from the printer yourself. This saves waiting for library staff to help you when they are attending to other students.

6. How much does it cost to print my work using my PIN as opposed to the old way?

A. Under the old system students pay – Per sheet - Black/White 15cents; Colour \$1.00. Under this *new system* students pay – per Sheet – **Black/White 10cents; Colour 50cents.**

7. When do I top up my account?

A. The printing pop up box displays the current balance. Printing jobs cannot exceed the available balance. Students need to visit the front office and top up their account with a minimum of \$5.00.

8. What if I don't use my account often? Is there a time limit on how long my money stays on my account?

A. There is no time limit, your account will be active whilst ever you attend THS and there is a balance in the account.

9. Can I print from the TAS Computer Room as well as the library?

A. At the moment you can only use the Library to print your work. We will be offering this service in the TAS Computer Room in the near future and will keep you informed.

You are then set to start printing. Just logon to computer as normal, have your work on the computer screen, press print, select printer – student_secure_Print. Follow the directions. Respond to the pop up box to select colour, duplex format, confirm selection, go to the "Library printer", enter PIN and retrieve print job.

If you need assistance, please ask our library staff who are more than happy to help.
